B. Revision to Fixing Time and Place of Regular Meetings

In order to continue to accommodate a greater number of attendees at its regular meetings, the Board has suggested it move all 2014 meetings originally scheduled for the Board Auditorium at Central Office to school facilities throughout the District. This is the First Reading and action will be taken at the next regular Board of Education meeting. There was discussion amongst Board members regarding appropriate locations for these meetings.

Board President Beebe called for a motion to retire to two (2) Executive Session.

Ms. Petrie Barcelona moved and Mr. Favre seconded the motion to move to two Executive Sessions (1) for the consideration of the purchase or sale of property at competitive bidding, if premature disclosure or information would give an unfair competitive or bargaining advantage to a person whose personal, private interest is adverse to the general public interest and (2) preparing for, conducting, or reviewing negotiations or bargaining sessions with public employees concerning their compensation or other terms and conditions of employment.
